



ERAMET

The Jules Garnier Prize 2001



This prize was initiated in 1965 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the discovery of nickel deposits in New Caledonia by Jules GARNIER, French Mining Engineer. It was awarded for the first time in 1966.

RULES

1. This competition awarded by **ERAMET** is open to any French or foreign person who is not employed by this Group nor by any of its subsidiaries.
2. It is awarded every two years to engineers, technicians or researchers, French and/or foreign.
3. It rewards an original, high quality work, scientific or technological, in direct relation with an industrial application involving Nickel or Nickel alloys. This work must deal with either the mining activity or any of these topics: elaboration, transformation, implementation, assembling, finishing.
4. This paper, not exceeding 20 typewritten pages, must not have been previously published, or previously submitted to this competition or any other.
5. The work may have more than one author belonging to different sectors or countries. The authors must present a brief curriculum vitae, together with a short list of their main published works to date.
6. Papers must be written in French by French authors, and written in English by the other authors (or in French if possible).
7. The deadline for submission of papers is 30 June, of the year the prize is being awarded. The work should be sent to:

8. Official opening for this competition will be announced one year before the deadline for submission of papers.
9. The Jury will consist of qualified personalities from research organisations and industries. Members of the jury are chosen by the ERAMET Group and the Société Française de Métallurgie et de Matériaux. Tenure of a jury member is 4 years and can be renewed once.
10. This price will be FRF 30 000.
11. The award will be presented during the plenary session of the Autumn meeting of the Société Française de Métallurgie et de Matériaux which takes place during the year of the competition.
12. The winning paper will be published in French or in English in the "Revue de Métallurgie".
